

RULES OF PARTICIPATION

SPACE APP CAMP 2018 INITIATED AND HOSTED BY ESA

ORGANISER OF THE APP CAMP

The 2018 edition of the Space App Camp is hosted by the European Space Agency (hereafter referred to as “ESA”) and organised by Anwendungszentrum GmbH Oberpfaffenhofen (hereafter referred to as “AZO”).

OBJECTIVE OF THE APP CAMP

The aim of the Space App Camp, is to create awareness for the possibilities offered by the European Earth Observation Programme [Copernicus](#). The App Camp shall facilitate mobile app development by providing developers with access to an [API](#) and insight into ESA’s Earth observation activities, in particular those related to Copernicus.

The expected output of the App Camp participants are Copernicus-based apps, ready to be brought to market.

DATE AND LOCATION

The App Camp 2018 will take place from 17 to 24 September 2018 at ESA’s centre for Earth observation (ESRIN) in Frascati near Rome/Italy (arrival on 16 September 2018). All accepted participants will have to confirm to attend for the whole duration of the App Camp.

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

Application is open from 4 June to 30 July 2018 via an online application form at www.app-camp.eu. Candidates need to have proven experience in app development, therefore links to published apps incl. reference to the applicant need to be included in the application. The online application form needs to be filled in completely in English language and submitted before 10:00 a.m. CEST on 30 July 2018.

Selection will be based upon the creativity shown in previous apps with regards to content, usability, design and business concept. Where candidates appear equally qualified, candidates from under-represented countries will have priority. Apart from personal details and previous experience, candidates shall state for which app category (see list below) they would like to apply, and why.

Candidates that have already participated onsite in one of the previous editions of the Space App Camp in Frascati cannot apply again.

TEAM SPIRIT

Candidates can apply alone or in teams of two, or four. If not already applying as team of four, all candidates will be grouped into teams of four. Candidates looking for team members are invited to join the dedicated "[team matching](#)" platform where they can find partners for their application. The goal is to help participants learn from others and get them out of their comfort zone.

ESA and AZO reserve the right to also assign candidates to categories other than indicated. 20 candidates will be selected and notified as of CW 32. Up to 4 seats may be given to beta testers of the H2020 project [Copernicus App Lab](#) in a separate evaluation process jointly with ESA. ESA and AZO shall assume no liability whatsoever for the outcome of the selection process.

CATEGORIES

Five challenges will inspire participants to create the solutions of tomorrow. We are looking for innovative application ideas and viable business cases that address one of the following [topics](#):

- Smart Farming
- Sustainable Development
- Future Living
- Smart Cities
- Digital Transport

EXPECTED OUTPUT

All teams are asked to already brainstorm on their topics and come up with a preliminary concept prior to the App Camp, to be presented on the first day of the Camp.

Access to the API and detailed information on Copernicus will also be provided to the selected participants previous to the Camp.

EVENT LOGISTICS AND RELATED COST

For all 20 selected participants AZO will coordinate the travel and accommodation arrangements, which will be funded by ESA. Arrival at the hotel is scheduled for the evening of 16 September 2018. Hotel and meals will be provided for the whole duration of the App Camp. Selected participants are expected to stay at the hotel reserved for the duration of the App Camp. Departure is Monday, 24 September 2018, in the afternoon.

The participants shall bring their own devices with Wi-Fi capability. ESA will provide the credentials for accessing the internet resources for the duration of the App Camp. The App Camp and all related communication will take place in English.

The selected participants will have to accept and respect the general on-site ESRIN rules for safety and security. A general presentation will be organised on the first day at ESRIN, including safety and security information.

Each participant shall provide ESA with a copy of the ID card or passport. An entry badge will be provided for the whole duration of the App Camp at ESRIN.

WHO CAN JOIN?

Participation in the App Camp is open to any app developer of adult age with citizenship in the following countries: ESA and EU member-states and countries participating in the Horizon 2020 Programme of the European Union, which are all listed hereafter: Albania, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, the Faroe Islands, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Malta, Montenegro, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, the United Kingdom and Canada.

Candidates who are permanently employed confirm with their application that their employers approve of their participation for the whole duration of the App Camp.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

One winning team will be selected after the final presentation of the app on the last day of the App Camp by a jury consisting of ESA and other representatives. The members of the winning team will receive a cash prize worth EUR 2,500.

DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

By participating, Participants acknowledge that their contact details will be passed on to ESA. ESA and AZO ensure not to pass on any other personal information to any third party. AZO will use the provided contact information to inform candidates of all matters related to the App Camp and of any other issues AZO deems relevant for the candidates. **The partners may then contact Participants to determine whether they are interested in moving forward with the ideas submitted. Any personal data will be deleted when no longer needed or required, or upon request. For further information on the deletion of personal and / or idea-related data please refer to our Privacy Policy.**

By participating in the App Camp, all participants acknowledge that ESA and AZO may use their photos and videos (incl. photos/videos taken of the participants during the App Camp), and descriptions of their apps developed during the App Camp in publicity or advertising concerning the App Camp or otherwise in any medium now known or hereafter devised (including the Internet or other interactive networks) at any place and time without further compensation or right of review and agree to waive their rights with respect to any such publicity and advertising.

PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

The Organiser shall handle and protect personal data within the frame of the Data Protection Law in Germany, article 4 (2) and article 28 of the DS GMO in the ways exclusively defined in this Agreement. The personal data is handled exclusively in a Member State of the European Union or in a Contracting State of the Agreement on the European Economic Area. Any transfer of personal data to a third country requires the prior consent of the data subjects and the Partner, and may only take place if it complies with applicable regulations and if the specific conditions of article 44 ff. DS GMO are met. The obligations related to personal data protection shall continue to be in effect for an unlimited period or as long as prescribed by applicable law. The Partner undertakes to comply with all applicable data protection laws.

RIGHTS

Participants will own the intellectual property rights to all their developments made during the App Camp. Ownership of the teams' output shall be with the teams' participants, who will jointly own the app concepts / draft developments. It is up to the respective teams to protect the developments in the relevant legislations, as far as the apps are in a development status allowing such protection.

The selected developers need to ensure that the output of their group work will be an app which will be clearly "free-standing", i.e. based on a software programme which is developed "from scratch" by the App Camp developers and does not contain already existing software from third parties. That will ensure that the later commercial use of the app(s) will not encounter any problems in terms of intellectual property rights belonging to a third party.

MISCELLANEOUS

The selection and award decisions shall not be subject to legal challenge. The decisions rendered by ESA and AZO shall be final and binding for all candidates applying and/or participating for/in the App Camp. Candidates/Participants shall have no right to a justification of such decisions.

ESA and AZO reserve the right to modify these terms, including any of the deadlines set forth herein, at any time.

Participation in this competition shall be governed by German law. Place of jurisdiction shall be Munich, Germany.
